Principals Message

What a busy and engaging Term 3 it has been! Our students have completed some incredibly impressive work, both inside and beyond the classroom. It has been wonderful to see them embrace new opportunities, rise to challenges and demonstrate our school values of being Respectful, Responsible and Resilient.

As a school, we have begun developing our strategic plan for the next three-year cycle. As part of this in Week 9 of Term 4, Wooroloo Primary School will undertake its Public-School Review. This review will provide a clear picture of where we are now, celebrate the progress we have made and help guide where we plan to go over the next three years.

Community feedback will be an important part of this process, and we will soon send a survey to all families. It is vital that families take the time to complete the survey and provide honest and constructive feedback. Your input will help ensure that our future direction reflects the needs, priorities and aspirations of our school community and that we continue to provide the best possible support for our students.

Over the past six months, we have worked hard alongside our students to create more contemporary, flexible and engaging learning environments. This focus will continue as we strengthen and consolidate our Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) approach and our Tier 1 Students at Educational Risk (SAER) processes. These whole-school practices will help ensure every student benefits from consistent expectations, high-quality classroom teaching and early support when needed.

With our indoor improvements almost complete, we are now turning our attention to the nature play area. The space already being improved with the addition of new shade sails. We are in the early stages of planning a three-year redevelopment of this area. Phase 1 will focus on essential site works and the installation of shade sails and one or two new pieces of play equipment. We hope to complete Phases 2 and 3 by the end of 2029.

Student voice will continue to be an important part of this process. After all, our students are the ones who use these spaces every day. Their ideas help us create environments that are engaging, inclusive and responsive to how they want to learn, play and connect with one another.

Although we still have one term remaining this year, planning for our 2027 class structures is already underway. Our preliminary planning will hopefully allow us to offer a separate Kindergarten and Pre-primary class three days each week. This would provide an exciting opportunity to place an even stronger focus on foundational literacy and numeracy, ensuring our youngest students receive the best possible start to their schooling journey at Wooroloo.

Term 3 has certainly been jam-packed, and I am incredibly proud of the way our students and staff have approached every opportunity with enthusiasm, resilience and a willingness to have a go. Thank you to our families and wider community for your continued support. I look forward to another positive and productive term ahead.

Junior Room - What We've Been Learning This Term!

Monday - Wednesday with Mrs Hoskins

The students have been busy little learners this term, with lots of exploring, creating and having fun along the way!

In Talk for Writing, the students stepped into the wonderful world of *The Gruffalo*. With guidance, they explored what makes a great narrative, with a particular focus on interesting characters and exciting settings. Together, they learnt and adapted *The Gruffalo's Journey* before using their own ideas to create stories. They also had a taste of procedural writing by learning how to make some delicious Gruffalo Crumble, yum!

In HASS, the students travelled around the world without even leaving the classroom! They explored the different hemispheres and discovered why seasons and weather vary depending on where people live. They also investigated animals from around the world, where they live and the different habitats they call home.

In Drama, the students used their imaginations and stepped into character. They explored the elements of drama and practised using their voices, facial expressions and bodies to portray different characters. They enjoyed acting out a range of fun scenarios while building their confidence and creativity.

In Health, the students learnt about Protective Behaviours and how they can help keep themselves safe. They explored their bodies' early warning signs, discussed safe and unsafe secrets, and identified the trusted adults they can turn to when they need support. Most importantly, they learnt that it is always okay to ask for help!

On Thursdays and Fridays with Mrs Chequer, we have been busy learning and developing our skills across Numeracy, Reading, Phonics and Visual Arts this term!

In Numeracy, our learning has focused on the Measurement and Geometry strand, with students exploring time, capacity and position. Through practical, hands-on activities, we have been learning to measure and compare capacity, develop our understanding of time and describe the position and location of objects using mathematical language.

In Reading, we have been building our comprehension skills by learning and applying a range of reading strategies, including predicting, making connections to ourselves, making text-to-text connections and visualising. A key focus has also been building our sight-word knowledge and developing strong reading habits. Students have been practising tracking as they read, using decoding strategies, reading with greater fluency and developing their comprehension.

In Phonics, students have been working at different stages of their phonics journey. Our Kindy students have begun Phase 2, learning the SATPIN sounds and beginning to blend and segment simple words. Pre-primary students have consolidated their Phase 2 phonics knowledge and are now moving into Phase 3, learning digraphs including sh, th, ch and ng. Our Year 1 students have completed Phase 3 and have been consolidating their knowledge of vowel digraphs, strengthening their ability to apply these patterns when reading and spelling.

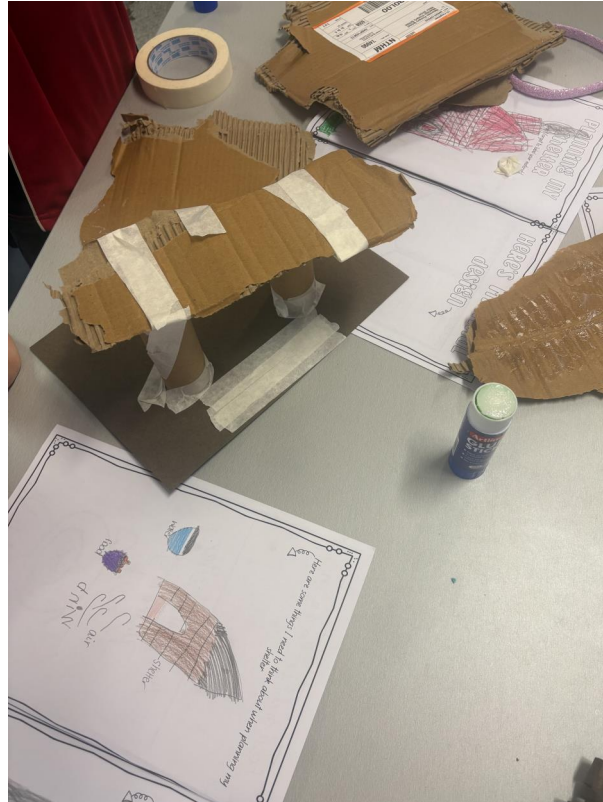
In Visual Arts, we have been working towards our Midland Junction Arts Competition piece based on the theme “Who Eats Who, or What, and When?”. Our focus is on Western Australian Black Cockatoos and their important relationship with native plants such as Banksia, Marri, Jarrah and Hakea. Students have explored drawing, observation, colour, composition and printmaking techniques, experimenting with texture, pattern and detail to create an artwork celebrating our unique Western Australian environment.

Alongside our classroom learning, we have also enjoyed being part of some exciting whole-school events and celebrations. These have included NAIDOC celebrations, Father’s Day, Book Week, Science Week and celebrating our 100th Day of School. These special events have provided wonderful opportunities for students to learn, connect, celebrate and create memorable experiences together as a school community.

Science and Technology with Mrs Alden

During Science we have been exploring chemical science, learning about different materials and their properties. We have enjoyed using our senses to explore different types of materials and then experimenting by mixing chemicals together. One of our favourite lessons was experimenting and finding the best materials to make a raincoat. This just so happened to occur on one of the wettest days of the year so far.

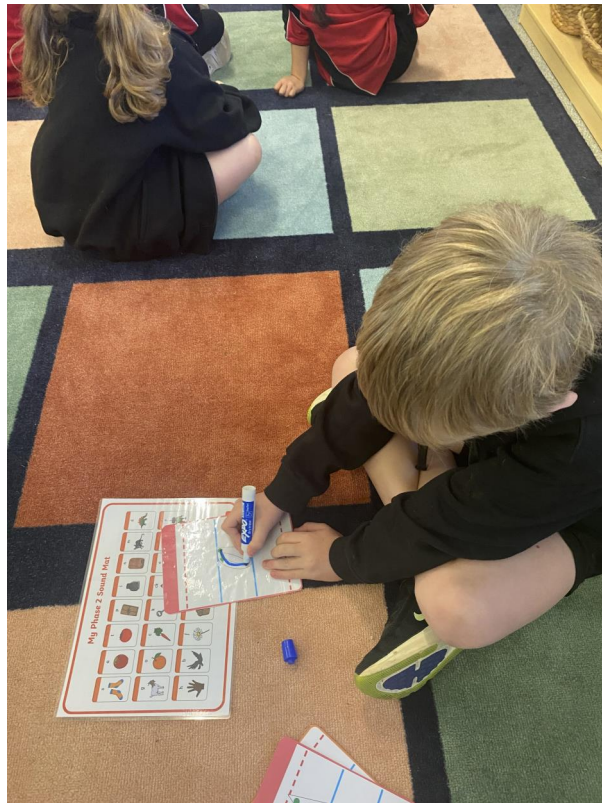
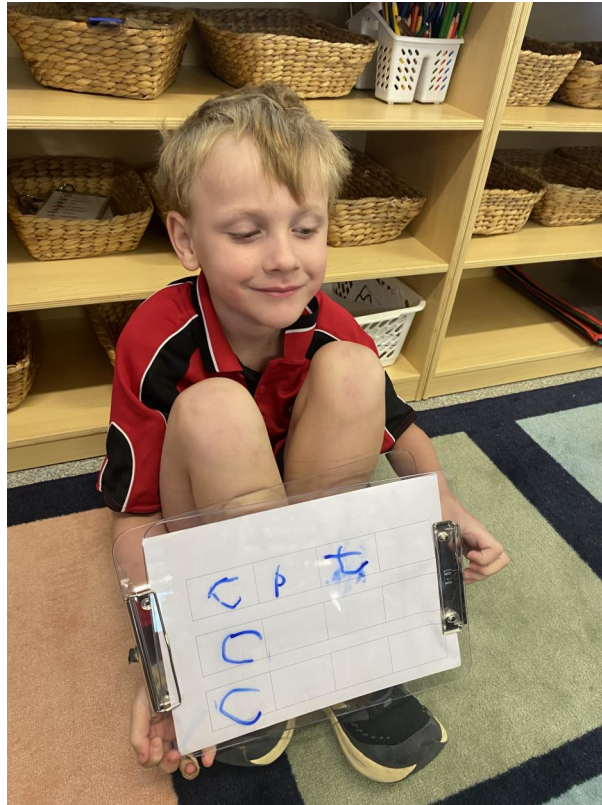
Tying in with our Science units we have been putting to use our planning and engineering skills to create animal shelters during Technology. We applied our learning from Biological Science in Term 1 where we explored the basic needs of plants and animals and have applied this to plan, create and evaluate shelter types for specific animals.















Senior Room - What a term!

We have been super busy this term both in the classroom and out! It has been a wonderful term filled with learning, hands-on experiences and life lessons.

In Talk for Writing, we have been exploring what makes an effective information report. Students have been learning about the key 'ingredients' such as classification, appearance, habitat, diet and behaviour. We have been developing our creativity skills by splicing together our own hybrid creatures where students combined features of different animals and applied their knowledge of an information report.

In Numeracy we have been developing our understanding of measurement with a focus on mass, capacity and volume. Through practical and hands-on activities, students have learnt to select appropriate units, estimate and compare measurements. Students have developed their understanding of measurement which they can now apply to their everyday lives when doing their chores at home 😊

During HASS, our Year 3 and 4 students have been researching Australia's natural features such as The Great Barrier Reef, exploring what makes these places unique. They have also

been comparing and contrasting Australia with its neighbouring countries, developing their understanding of different countries, cultures and ways of living.

Our Year 5 and 6 students have been researching countries within Asia and the Americas. They have investigated similarities and differences between Australia and these countries and have created posters displaying their findings.

In Physical Education we have been focusing on developing their athletic skills in preparation for the athletics carnival. It's great to see many of the student have mastered the triple jump and improved in their hand-eye coordination and general fitness level. Watch out Wundowie, we some super athletes in the making.

We are so proud of our students in Room 1. They have shown great resilience, enthusiasm, creativity and curiosity for their own learning. We look forward to continuing to build on these skills and making the most out of our final term of the year!

Science and STEM with Mrs Taylor

Room 1 has been buzzing with curiosity, investigation and discovery throughout the term. In Physical Sciences, the students have explored the different states of matter and developed a greater understanding of the world around them. They have also been introduced to elements and the periodic table, learning that everything around us is made from different types of matter.

The wonderful scientists of Room 1 have begun using scientific vocabulary and applying the processes required to design and conduct reliable experiments. They have learnt how to make predictions, identify variables, follow a method, observe changes, record results and draw conclusions based on the evidence they collect.

The students have conducted several exciting experiments this term:

- **The Great Race:** The students compared the viscosity of different liquids by observing how quickly each liquid moved. They discovered that some liquids flow more easily than others.
- **The Coin Challenge:** Students carefully placed and counted droplets of water on the surface of a coin. This allowed them to observe the surface tension of water and investigate why the droplets joined together before spilling over the edge.
- **Conductor or Insulator?:** The students tested a variety of materials to determine whether they allowed heat or electricity to pass through them. They then classified each material as a conductor or an insulator.

- **The pH Scale:** Students investigated the acidity and alkalinity of common household substances. They used their observations to place the substances on the pH scale and identify them as acidic, neutral or alkaline.
- **The Yeast Experiment:** To finish the term, the students will investigate how yeast reacts under different conditions. They will make predictions, observe the changes that occur and use their results to explain what yeast needs to become active.

During STEM, the students explored how hydraulic systems use pressure to create movement. They applied their understanding to design, build and test their own hydraulic lifts. Throughout the challenge, they demonstrated creativity, teamwork and resilience as they evaluated their designs and made improvements.

HEC Science Day

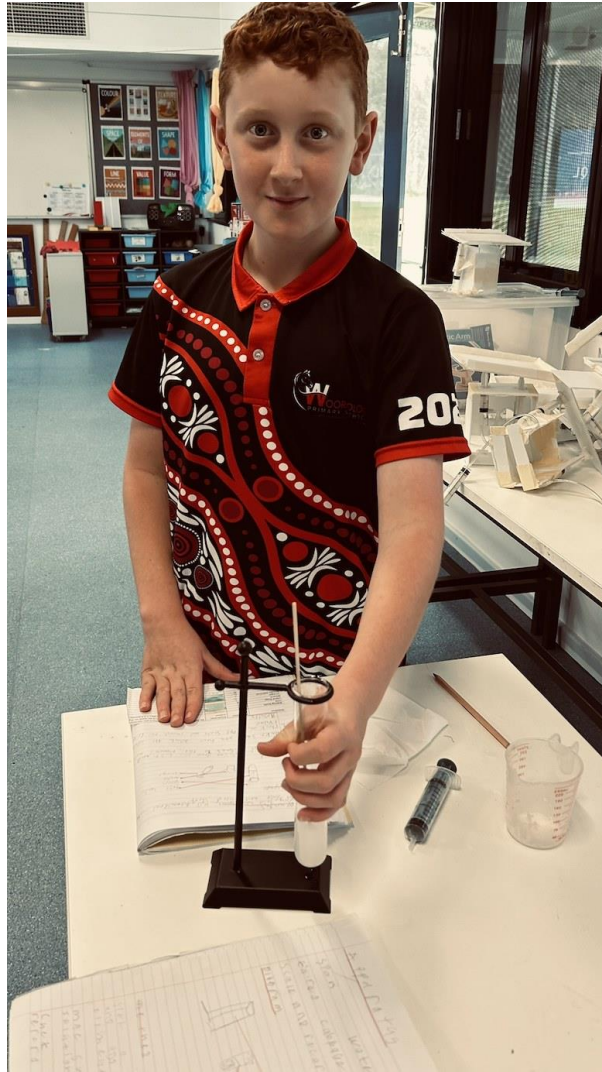

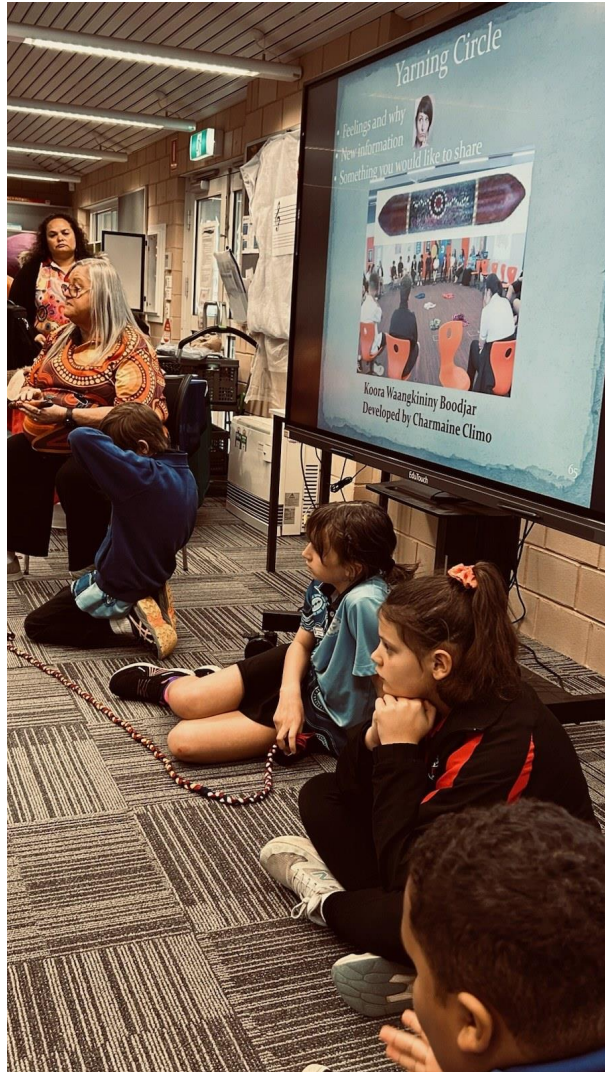
Through storytelling, discussion and yarning, students were encouraged to listen, share and develop a deeper understanding and respect for Aboriginal perspectives and experiences.

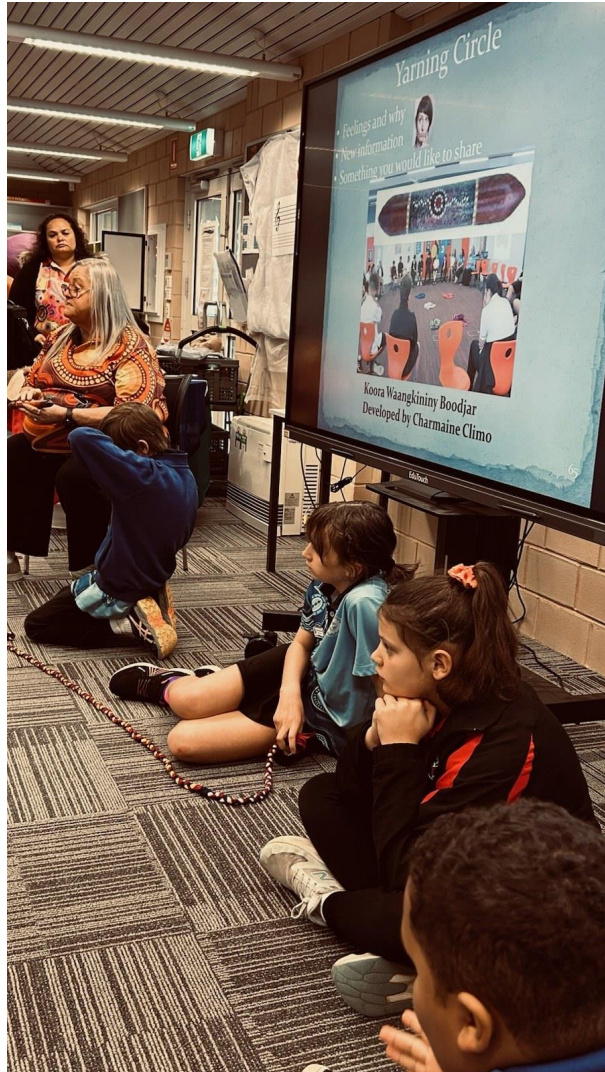

FRUIT AND VEGETABLES AS BATTERIES!

Most could work as batteries, but what about other possible fruits as cells? Lemons, potatoes, apples and other fruits?

As tested:

- pieces of fruit for vegetable like a lemon, potato, or apple
- connected to a circuit with a small light bulb
- A zinc electrode (negative) and a copper electrode (positive)
- A digital multimeter
- Then connected with each other

2. Do the experiment:

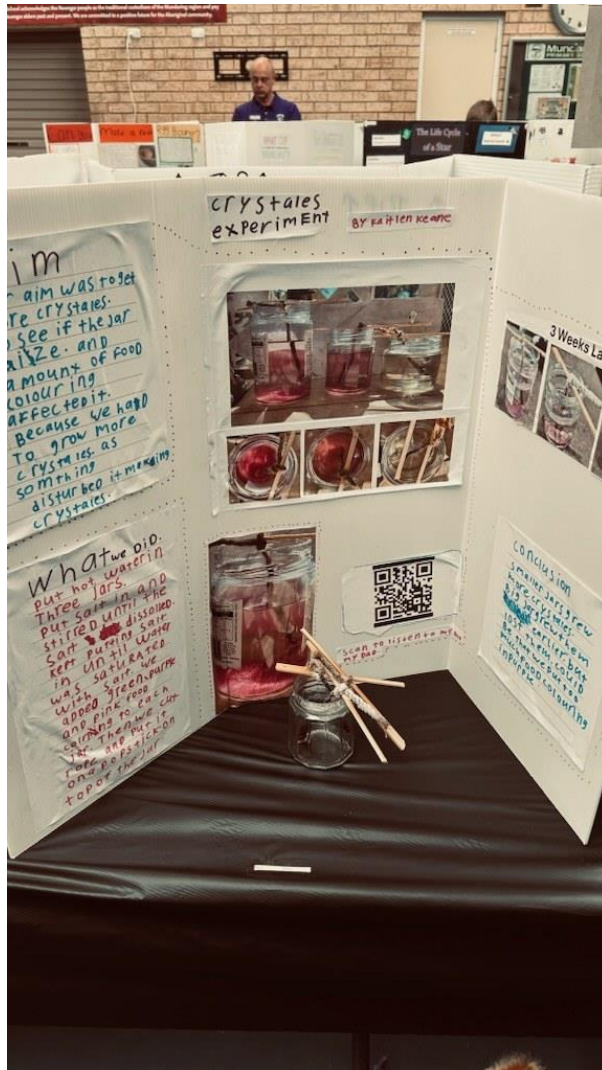
- Use fruit and vegetable as a battery
- Use a digital multimeter to measure the voltage
- Use a small light bulb to test the circuit
- Use a zinc electrode (negative) and a copper electrode (positive)
- Use a digital multimeter to measure the voltage

QUESTION

What acids and bases are in the home?

HOW I CAME UP WITH MY QUESTION

One night, we were making poke bowls for dinner and Dad was using cabbage. He said "Look at this" and he put lemon in the leftover cabbage bowl - it turned the cabbage pink. He then put some drain cleaner on some cabbage and it went blue. Dad explained to me that cabbage is an indicator. I thought that was really cool, so I wanted to find out what other things in the house were acids and bases.

WHAT ARE ACIDS AND BASES?

Acids and bases are chemicals that are liquid. Their chemical make-up tells us if they are an acid or a base.

ACID	BASE (also called Alkaline)
Have Hydrogen Ions	Have Hydroxide Ions
Usually sour	Usually bitter

An indicator is used to test the pH of something. You can tell whether a liquid is an Acid or Base by using an indicator and checking the colour against a pH scale. The pH scale goes from 0 to 14 and shows how many hydrogen ions there are in something.

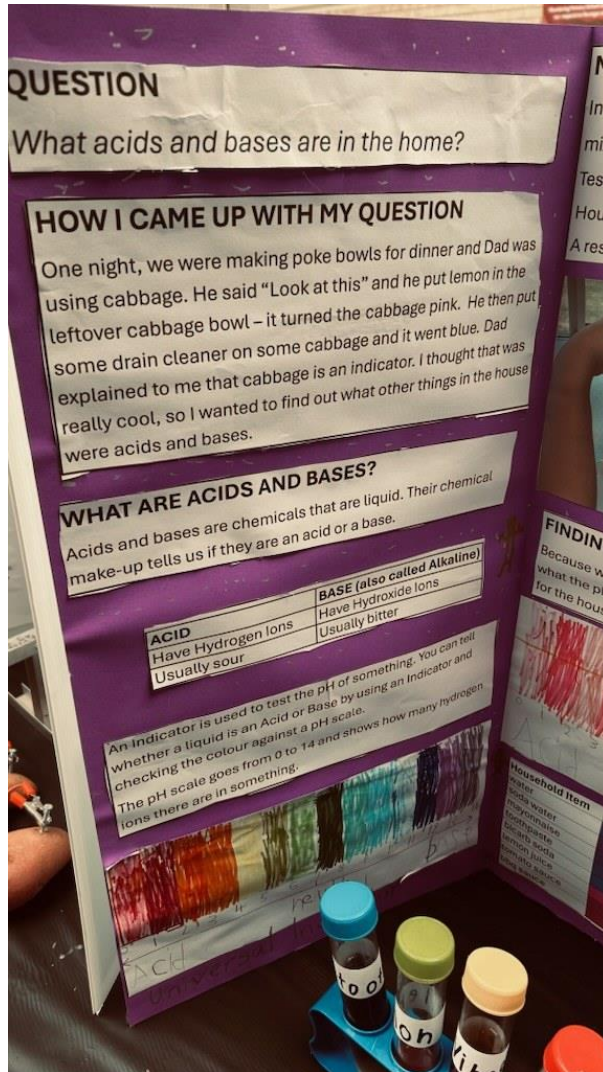

The WA Student Assistance Payment is available to help eligible Western Australian families with the cost of school expenses.

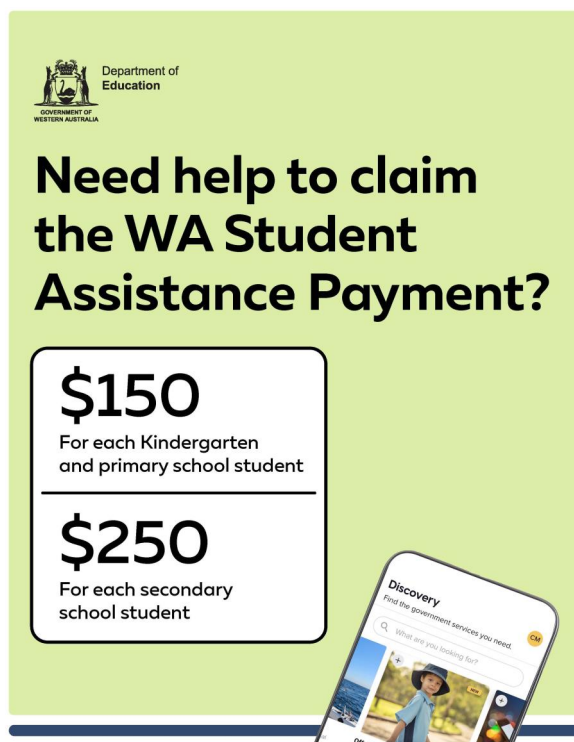
Families may be eligible to receive financial assistance to help with expenses such as school supplies, uniforms, excursions, camps and other educational costs.

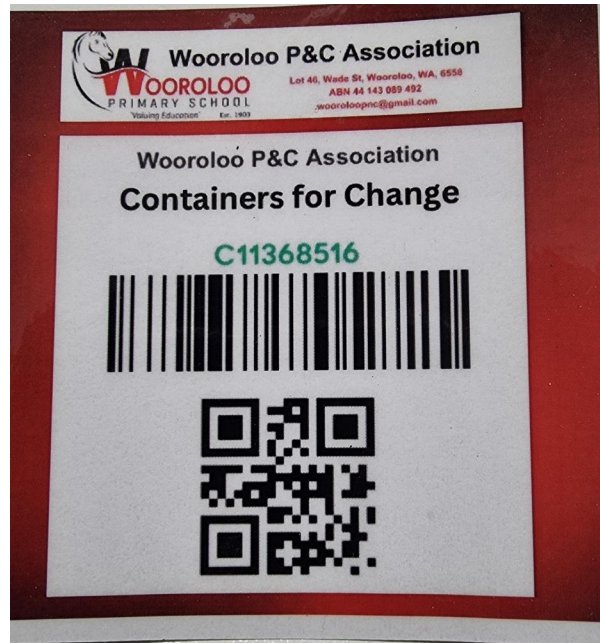
Containers for Change Fundraiser! ♻️
