

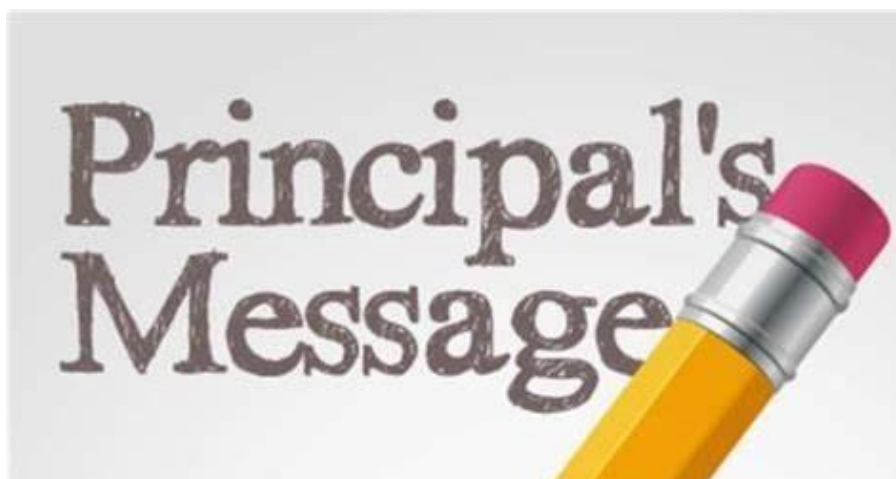

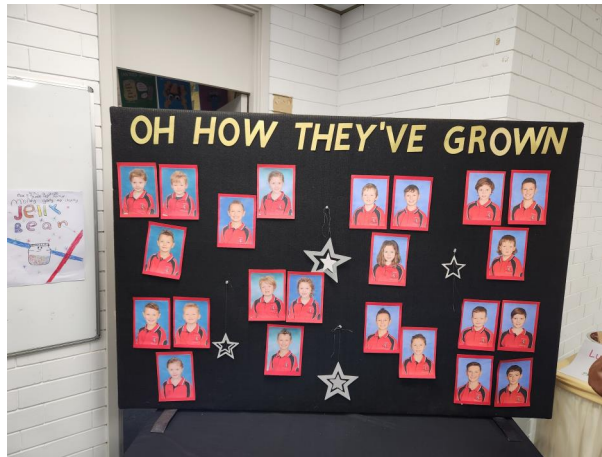

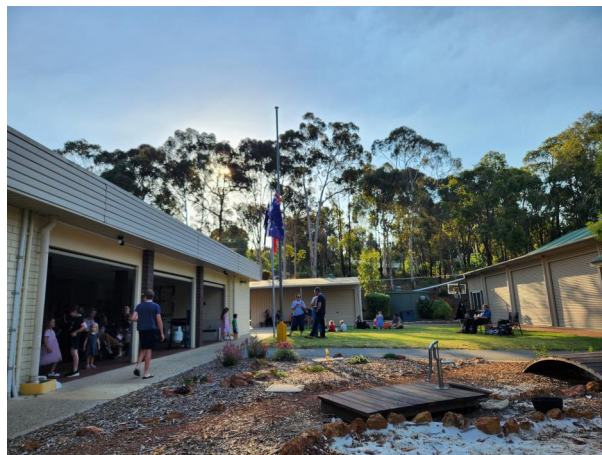












Year 5/ 6 Camp

Lithium-ion Batteries: Stay Safe!



Lithium-ion Batteries: Stay Safe!

We use lithium-ion batteries every day — in phones, laptops, e-scooters, power tools and more. But if they're damaged, overheated or charged the wrong way, they can quickly become a fire risk.

Common mistakes that cause fires:

- Using cheap or dodgy chargers
- Charging batteries while they're still hot
- Leaving them on charge for too long
- Dropping or damaging the battery
- Leaving them in cars, sunlight or under bedding
- Charging overnight or in unattended areas
- Running batteries down to 0%

These problems can make a battery overheat and fail — and that's when fires happen. DFES has already recorded 94 lithium-ion battery incidents in WA this year, including 55 house fires.

Take action this month!

- Review where and how you charge devices at home.
- Talk with your family about battery safety - especially with kids and teens.
- Check your smoke alarms and make sure everyone knows what to do in case of a fire.
- Make sure you have a Home Fire Escape Plan - <https://publications.dfes.wa.gov.au/publications/home-fire-escape-plan-family>.
- Find your nearest battery recycling location and safely dispose of any old or damaged batteries.

Containers for Change Fundraiser! ♻️

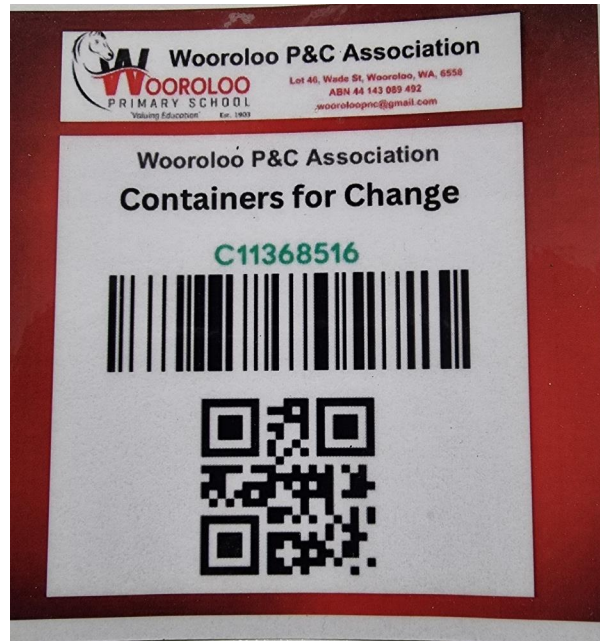


Wooroloo Primary P&C are excited to invite all families to join in our **Containers for Change Fundraiser!** ♻️

you will need to submit a new application.
